

MUEHLENBECKIA

Wire Plant

**axillaris**

zones 6–9 · ○ MUEAX
3" creeping sub-shrub with tiny, glossy, wire-like green foliage and ornamental black fruits.

OENOTHERA

Evening Primrose

caespitosa

zones 4–7 · ○ ● OENCA
Clump-forming prostrate species with 4" long narrow, hairy leaves that are clustered to form a rosette. Erect flower buds give way to 2-3" wide fragrant flowers which open at night, almost covering the plant. The flowers open white and fade to pink and persist for 4-6 weeks. Grow in scree or gravelly soils in dry, sheltered sunny locations.

OROSTACHYS**furusei**

zones 4–10 · ○ OROFU
This interesting perennial forms succulent gray rosettes. Excellent for the rock garden or as a groundcover.

OXYTROPIS**lapponica**

zones 3–8 · ○ OXYLA
Violet-blue pea flowers in summer on this 4" tall growing shrublet.

purpurea

zones 3–8 · ○ OXYPU
Purple blooms in summer above gray foliage on this tidy, 6" shrublet.

PAPAVER

Oriental Poppy

radicatum

zones 3–8 · ○ PAPRA
Sulphur-yellow blooms on stems held well above the compact foliage rosettes in May-June.

rhaeticum

zones 3–8 · ○ PAPRH
Golden yellow blooms on long stems in May-June.

alpinum hybrids

Alpine Poppy
zones 3–8 · ○ PAPAL
Grows to 12". A dainty alpine with finely cut gray-green leaves. Blooms of mixed colors appear July-Aug. Great for the rock garden or small garden area.

miyabeanum 'Pacinio'

Alpine Poppy
zones 3–8 · ○ PAPP
6-8" rosettes of hairy mint green leaves bear sulphur-yellow flowers in May-June.

PARAHEBE**decora**

zones 6–9 · ○ PARDE
Tidy little evergreen sub-shrub from New Zealand with dark green foliage, covered with small blue flower spikes in summer.

PARONYCHIA**kapela ssp. serphyllifolia**

Nailwort
zones 6–9 · ○ PARSE
Very compact mat-forming plant with silvery gray-green leaves. Bears tiny green flowers enclosed by ornamental silvery, papery bracts.

PENSTEMON

Beard Tongue

hirsutus

Beard Tongue
zones 4–9 · ○ ● PENHI
Very open, leafless, nodding inflorescence are violet and are borne on 30-36" stems in June-Aug.

hirsutus 'Pygmaeus'

Beard Tongue
zones 4–9 · ○ ● PENPY
8" dwarf form with similar flowers as above.

linarioides ssp. coloradoensis

zones 4–9 · ○ ● PENLC
Needle-like green leaves form tiny mats covered with 6-9" lilac to purple flowers in summer. This Southwest American native is suitable for the trough garden.

pinifolius 'Compactus'

Beard Tongue
zones 4–9 · ○ ● PENPC
Compact, shrubby plant. Low bushes are adorned by tubular crimson flowers in summer. Grows 4-8".

pinifolius 'Mersea Yellow'

zones 7–9 · ○ ● PENMY
A rare yellow form of the compact, shrubby plant. Low bushes of needle-like foliage are covered with spikes of tubular yellow flowers.

strictus

zones 3–9 · ○ ● PENST
A dense mat of somewhat glossy, oval leaves with 14-16" flower stems bearing dark lilac flowers in June-July.

whippleanus

Beard Tongue
zones 4–9 · ○ ● PENWH
4-6" stems produce purple-blue flowers June-July.

PERSICARIA

(Polygonum) · Fleeceflower



capitata 'Magic Carpet'

zones 4–9 · ○ ● PERMC
Bronze leaved groundcover with rose-pink flowers all summer.

PHLOX

MOUNTAIN OR MOSS PINKS



subulata 'Betty'

Mountain or Moss Pink
zones 4–8 · ○ PLSBE
Forms neat low clumps 1-2" tall and 4" wide. Great for rockeries. Bright rosy pink flowers bloom in spring.

POLEMONIUM

Jacob's Ladder

eximium

zones 5–7 · ● POLEX
Creamy-white, flushed purple, tubular blossoms above feathery foliage in spring. Compact form, growing 8" tall.

POTENTILLA

Cinquefoil



crantzii (alpestris)

zones 3–7 · ○ ● POTCR
4" tufted dwarf cinquefoil, with loose clusters of golden yellow flowers, often orange blotched at base. Spring flowering.



neumanniana 'Nana'

zones 5–7 · ○ ● POTNN
2" mats covered in yellow flowers in April. Good rock garden plant.

PRATIA



pedunculata 'Country Park'

zones 6–9 · ○ PRACP
Low-growing groundcover with fragrant, deep blue blossoms in summer. Native of Tasmania.

PRIMULA

Primrose



auricula

zones 5–8 · ● ● PRIAU
True yellow alpine auricula flowers, on 12" stems, in April-May. Thick, large blue-gray leaves.

capitata ssp. mooreana

zones 5–8 · ● PRICM
Fascinating dark violet, silver powdered blossoms in July- Aug.



farinosa

zones 5–8 · ● ● PRIFA
Many pretty yellow-throated pink flowers stand 4-8" tall in April-May. Easily cultivated by seed.



rosea 'Gigas'

zones 5–8 · ● ● PRIRG
8" clusters of large bright crimson blossoms with a yellow eye. Good spring bloomer.

sikkimensis

zones 5–8 · ● ● PRISK
Fragrant yellow flower clusters on tall, 18" stems above compact rosettes of foliage in June-July.

sinopurpurea

zones 5–8 · ● ● PRISP
Late spring bloomer with magenta, purple or violet funnel-shaped flowers on 12" upright stalks in clusters of 6-12 blooms at a time.



veris

Cowslip Primrose
zones 4–8 · ● ● PRIVE
Slender 8" stems with dainty umbels of light yellow blossoms in April-May.



veris 'Sunset Shades'

zones 5–8 · ● ● PRISS
Spring flowers are a mix of orange to deep red with warm yellow throats that contrast nicely with the hot petal colors. Grows to 8".



x pubescens 'Exhibition Blue'

zones 3–8 · ● ● PRIPB
A cross between P. auricula and P. rubra with spatulate to spoon-shaped leaves that form 8" tall rosettes. Blue flowers with white centers bloom in spring.



x pubescens 'Exhibition Red'

zones 5–8 · ● ● PRIPD
Same as above, but with red flowers that have white centers.



x pubescens 'Exhibition Yellow'

zones 5–8 · ● ● PRIPY
Same as above, but with yellow flowers that have white centers.

PULSATILLA

Pasque Flower

halleri

zones 5–7 · ● ● PULHA
Violet anemone-like blooms on 8" plants in early summer.

halleri ssp. taurica

zones 5–7 · ● ● PULHT
More compact than the species, to 6" tall, with white-woolly foliage and purple-violet blooms in late spring.

• RANUNCULUS

Buttercup



yakusimanus

zones 3–7 • ○ ● RANYA

Charming hardy, long blooming rock garden plant. Tiny bright yellow buttercup flowers over dark green, mat-like silver veined foliage.

• RAOULIA



australis (hookeri)

zones 7–9 • ○ RAOAU

Tiny, intensely silver leaves form prostrate, ground-hugging cushions up to 3' across. Good drainage essential. Hardy to zone 6 with protection.

subsericea

zones 7–9 • ○ RAOUSU

NEW! A unique dense gray-green groundcover from New Zealand. Straw-colored flowers with white tips appear in summer and are more prominent than those of other genus members at 1 cm wide. Great for the sand bed or rock garden!

• ROSULARIA

(Sempervivella)

chrysantha

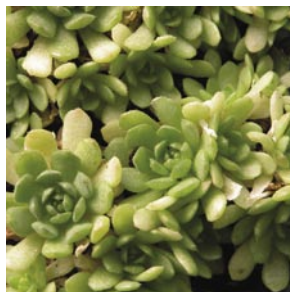
zones 5–9 • ○ ROSCH

Mat former with emerald-green, thick leaves and white blooms in late spring.

sempervivum ssp. glaucophyllum

zones 5–9 • ○ ROSGL

Tidy, flat grower with attractive thick blue leaves and white flowers in late spring.



muratdaghensis

zones 5–9 • ○ ROSMU

Similar in appearance to a hairy-leaved Sempervivum, with small creamy white to yellow tubular flowers on short erect spikes in summer. From the Rocky Mountain Rare Plant Society, it is native to the Turkish Mts.



pallida

zones 5–9 • ○ ROSPA

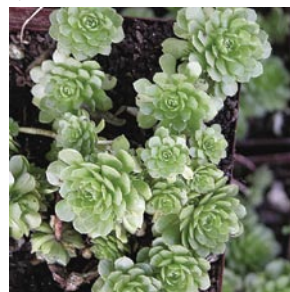
Rosettes 1-1.5" wide with offsets. 8" flower stalks have white to yellowish flowers in spring, often with red stripes.



rechingeri

zones 5–9 • ○ ROSRE

Similar to a hairy-leaved Sempervivum with small light pink flowers on short erect spikes in summer.



sedoides var. alba

zones 5–9 • ○ ROSSA

Little green, pink-flushed rosettes are adorned with short sprays of substantial white flowers in early summer.

• RUSCHIA

South African Mesembs



pulvinaris

zones 5–9 • ○ RUSPU

Silvery blue, gnarly, pointed leaves. The epitome of a rock garden specimen. Unusual and special!
